While at Lands' End you can view the remains of the Sutro Baths and overlook the majestic Pacific Ocean with the Golden Gate Bridge off in the distance. Our tour continues to Twin Peaks the highest point in the city where you will have 360 degree views of the city and the bay. As our tour continues through Golden Gate Park, you'll also travel thru Chinatown, Nob Hill, past San Francisco City Hall and thru the city's downtown before returning to Fisherman's Wharf.
